» 2025 Meetings Plan | Pre-Award Network Meetings

» Pre-Award Network Meeting 06 | 2025 (05sep2025)

According to the decisions from last Pre-Award Network meeting, DPFC's information will be disclosed through NoW, Teams or on the website repository. Therefore, the following meetings will have a slightly different configuration: period for questions or feedback regarding DPFC's information, short presentation from the host on pre-award and R&I activities and a period of discussion around specific subjects chosen by the research managers.

» Financial feasibility of European applications

DP has updated the <u>budget calculation tool</u> for European projects to facilitate the analysis of the **financial feasibility** of proposals.

Further improvements will still be introduced, such as the **annual salary update**, but for now, since the file does not yet include this automatic update, it is recommended to **assume a 3% annual salary increase** for personnel costs.

We are also sharing the <u>Technical Guidance</u> regarding **IST's internal overheads**, and inform you that the **Technical Guidance for IST-ID's internal overheads** is currently under validation.





As a good practice, it is established that **all budgets must be sent to DP** for financial feasibility analysis by:

- 2 weeks before the deadline for: ERC, Pathfinder, Transition, Infrastructures, MSCA, Widening
- 1 week before the deadline for: Pillar 2 collaborative projects

» News of the Week (NoW) Assessment | FOLLOW UP

The assessment survey published in NoW #23 gathered important feedback, relevant in terms of quantity and quality.

The satisfaction was positive, and continuity was asked for. However, the general opinion is that it could be more focused on institutional and cross-cutting issues relevant for the pre-award activity. You can find the report HERE






» IST/ IST-ID performance in European Programs 2021-2024




1 - Evolution of IST/IST-ID participation in European Programs | HE Projects: 120 - 39M€




2 - HE ERC Projects: 3 projects - 4,1M€ (~1,4 M€/project)








3 - **HE EIC Pathfinder Projects:** 4 projects - 2,5 M€ (~625k€/ project)







2. POLICY NEWS

» 2025 State of the Digital Decade Package (source: EC)

The report assesses the EU's progress toward its 2030 digital transformation goals under the Digital Decade Policy Programme. It highlights both achievements—like improvements in public service digitalisation and edge computing—and persistent gaps in connectivity, digital skills, and technological sovereignty. Key challenges include dependence on non-EU providers for AI, cloud, and semiconductors, a lack of advanced ICT specialists, and underdeveloped infrastructure such as fibre networks and satellite systems. The growing energy demands of AI and data technologies are outpacing clean energy capacity, threatening future scalability. The report raises concerns over online misinformation, digital inequality, and mental health risks, particularly for minors. Member States have proposed nearly €289 billion in digital measures, yet structural weaknesses and uneven progress remain. The report calls for stronger civil-defence tech collaboration, investment in secure digital infrastructure, and acceleration of AI adoption. It urges reforms to strengthen the EU single market and reduce administrative burdens to support innovation. Achieving Digital Decade targets could boost EU GDP by up to 1.8% and strengthen economic and technological sovereignty. The report concludes that 2025 is a critical turning point, requiring bold and coordinated action across sectors.

» European Chemicals Industry Action Plan (source: EC)

The European Commission has launched the <u>European Chemicals Industry Action Plan</u> to strengthen the competitiveness and sustainability of the chemical sector, which underpins over 96% of manufactured goods in Europe. Central to this plan is promoting **innovation and safe, sustainable products**, aligned with the broader Life Sciences Strategy. Key initiatives include a **revised** <u>Safe and Sustainable by Design (SSbD) framework</u>, supporting the replacement of harmful substances with better alternatives. The EU is also launching **Innovation and Substitution Hubs** and preparing an **Advanced Materials Act** by 2026 to accelerate and reward innovation. The SSbD framework is positioned to become a **global standard** for safe, sustainable, and competitive industrial innovation.





» New Life Sciences Strategy (source: EC)

The European Commission has launched a <u>new Life Sciences Strategy</u> to make Europe the world's most attractive hub for life sciences by **2030**, aiming to boost health, environmental sustainability, and economic growth. The sector already adds **€1.5 trillion to the EU economy** and supports **29 million jobs**, but faces challenges in turning research into real-world innovations. Backed by over **€10 billion annually**, the strategy focuses on accelerating R&D, enabling faster market access, and building public trust in technologies such as microbiome-based solutions, biomanufacturing, and advanced materials. Key actions include an **EU Biotech Act**, new funding tools, and a matchmaking platform for startups, industry, and investors. The strategy also seeks to improve coordination across EU policies, mobilizing **€300 million** for innovation procurement in areas like climate adaptation, vaccines, and cancer treatment.

» Dual use in next European Program (source: <u>Science Business</u>)

The European Parliament is increasingly divided over whether to allow **dual-use research**—projects with both civilian and defence applications—into the next EU research Framework Programme (FP10). Proponents, like MEP Eszter Lakos, argue dual-use is a **strategic necessity** for Europe's security and competitiveness, urging a uniquely European approach and integration with the **European Competitiveness Fund**. The European Commission has confirmed that dual-use projects will be eligible in FP10, shifting away from the **civilian-only focus** of previous programmes. Critics, including MEP René Repasi, warn this could **threaten academic openness**, increase bureaucracy, and limit international collaboration due to security constraints. As EU member states align defence strategies with research funding, debates continue over whether dual-use inclusion will enhance innovation or compromise EU research values.

» European strategy on research and technology infrastructures (source: <u>Science Business</u>)





The European Commission has launched a new strategy on research and technology infrastructures to strengthen Europe's global leadership in science and innovation. The strategy aims to make cutting-edge facilities, data, and services more accessible to researchers, innovators, and industry across the EU. It highlights Europe's existing strengths—such as particle accelerators, clean rooms, and pilot production lines—as essential to supporting the entire innovation cycle, from basic research to market-ready technologies. To enhance impact, the strategy outlines five key action areas: expanding and aligning infrastructure capacities, improving access, attracting talent, streamlining governance, and boosting international cooperation. It also emphasizes digitalisation and Al integration to modernize research infrastructures. The strategy seeks to create clear career pathways in technical and scientific roles, support talent development, and attract global researchers under the 'Choose Europe' initiative. Improved governance will support long-term investment planning and better coordination among Member States and funding sources. The international dimension includes collaboration with strategic partners and associated countries while also addressing critical infrastructure security and risk management. Ultimately, it positions research and technology infrastructures as pillars of EU competitiveness and the foundation of the "fifth freedom": the free movement of research, innovation, and knowledge.

This is change from previous practice and makes the Horizon Europe work programmes more transparent and accessible to all stakeholders. 4. NETWORKING & PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

» Looking for experts for a COST Action on Green Energy

The CEU Democracy Institute is exploring the possibility of a COST Action network on Green Energy Transitions (GETs) and is looking for partners interested in shaping a collaborative European research agenda.

Planned topic: The network will examine how the move to net zero is reorganising economies, politics, and societies, and envisage the following thematic foci:

- Justice, Inclusion & Coalitions What does a "just transition" mean across different contexts, sectors, and scales? How do claims around distribution, recognition, intergenerational fairness, and rights of nature shape transitions? And how are cross-class coalitions realigned or transformed at national and international levels?
- · Varieties of Green Capitalisms & Green Valuations How do public policies, corporate strategies, and financial logics converge or diverge in constructing "green capitalisms"? What new forms of valuation (carbon markets, ESG metrics, biodiversity credits) are emerging, and how do they reshape accumulation? To what extent do GETs transform or reproduce existing growth models, and with what consequences for labour, democracy, and inequality?
- Extractivism & Resource Frontiers How are energy transitions reshaping extractive regimes for critical minerals and land, and what new forms of resistance, dispossession, and conflict emerge?
- Geopolitics, Trade & Production Networks How do critical minerals, trade regimes, and resource nationalism (re)configure global competition and cooperation? How are transnational production networks in energy and industry being reorganised, and what does this mean for core–periphery hierarchies?
- · Knowledge, Labour & Land Whose knowledge counts in shaping transitions? How are labour regimes restructured across class, race, gender, and migration? How do competing ontologies of land and nature play out in struggles around extractivism and renewable energy infrastructures?
- Supranational Institutions & Regulation What role do supranational institutions (EU, WTO, MDBs, UN agencies) play in structuring the markets, regulations, and politics of GETs? How do their interventions interact with national strategies and local resistances?
