Mariana Santa-Marta studied Biology (1996–2001) and has a PhD in Microbiology (2002–2006) at Universidade de Lisboa. She did a Postdoctoral training in California, returned to Portugal in a Ciência Position at the Faculty of Pharmacy where she became actively involved in grant writing, project management, and researcher training. She specialized in research management by volunteering at the Pre-Award office of Instituto Gulbenkian de Ciência and pursued a postgraduate course in Project Management at ISEG. She gained hands-on experience through short-term roles in various Lisbon research offices, by establishing the Pre-Award Office in the Chemistry Department of FCT NOVA, playing a key role in launching the Pre-Award Office at Champalimaud and securing funding for numerous projects, including Horizon 2020 and Horizon Europe. Since November 2021, she has led the Pre-Award efforts at both CERENA and CEGIST at IST. Mariana specialized in individual support for Pillar 1 applications, including the MSCA-PF and ERC schemes. Her ERC track record includes establishing a structured internal program at CERENA and CEGIST to strategically prepare researchers for ERC applications, resulting in 8 submissions for the 2023 to 2025 calls —with candidates advancing to interviews and resubmissions. To date, she has directly supported 22 ERC applications across IST and the Champalimaud Foundation, with 12 advancing to interviews and 7 securing funding (3 awaiting results).
